Who is this camp for?

This camp is designed for children ages 5–10 who would benefit from extra support or enrichment in reading and math. It is ideal for children who enjoy hands-on learning, animals, and outdoor environments.

Is this a riding camp?

No. This is an academic tutoring camp. Horses are used as a learning tool and motivator, not for riding instruction.

How are academics taught?

Instruction is:

- Small-group and differentiated
- Based on each child's skill level
- Hands-on and movement-based
- Aligned with early elementary literacy and math skills
- Children are grouped flexibly so they feel supported and successful.

How are horses involved?

Children will interact with horses through:

- Observation and journaling
- Grooming and basic care (age-appropriate & supervised)
- Math and literacy activities connected to barn routines
- Safety and calm interaction are always the priority.

What is the daily schedule like?

Each day includes:

- Structured literacy instruction
- Hands-on math activities
- Snack & movement breaks
- Horse-based learning activities
- Creative projects and reflection
- The day balances focus with movement and outdoor time.

What should my child bring?

- Snack and water bottle
- Closed-toe shoes (required)
- Comfortable outdoor clothing
- Hat & sunscreen (weather permitting)

What about safety?

- All horse interactions are supervised
- Small group size allows for close monitoring
- Activities are age-appropriate and structured
- Emergency contact information is kept on file

What is the camper-to-teacher ratio?

Maximum of 10 campers, allowing for personalized attention and individualized support.

What if my child has different academic needs?

Differentiation is built into the program. Children are supported at their individual level, whether they need reinforcement or enrichment.
